Circular 5 of ASA 2018 (01/17) – INCENTIVES TO ATHLETES AND COACHES FOR SETTING NEW ASA RECORDS

Follow-up on 2017 ASA Circular 162.

As part of ASA’s continues quest for incentivising athletes and coaches to improve the quality of their performances, ASA will be paying incentives to the value of R220 000.00 to athletes, and their coaches, whom set new ASA records in the senior and junior categories.

The incentives to athletes and coaches follow shortly after ASA’s announcement in December 2017 to incentivise athletes whom won medals at the 2017 IAAF World Championships. Collectively the amount of incentives paid to athletes and their coaches over the past month totals almost 1 million rand.

Furthermore ASA has announced in November 2017 a new Grand Prix Series which will take place in March 2018 where athletes will be able to win more incentives and at the same time will be able compete against some of the world’s best athletes in preparation for the 2018 Commonwealth Games. More information in this regard will follow soon.
